About the course

- The Canterbury Course is an acclaimed and extremely popular FRCR Part 2 (Oncology) revision course within the UK and has been for many years. It was first established 41 years ago in Canterbury, Kent and was the first of its kind. It remains the key choice of course for candidates preparing for the UK Oncology FRCR. We continuously work to ensure the course format changes over the years to remain relevant and in keeping with changes in the FRCR and oncology practice. Over recent years we have had many candidates attend the UK course from overseas and the feedback received has led us to now bring the course to an overseas venue. As the current generation of Kent oncologists, we are proud to be custodians of the course and to continue the long tradition of postgraduate education from The Kent Oncology Centre. We are extremely proud to be bringing our global course to The Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvananthapuram, India.
- We will be running the course over 3 days in keeping with the format and ethos of our established and successful UK course. We will be sharing our wealth of experience of both clinical practice and FRCR examination preparation and technique.
- DAY 1 & 2 - this will be centred around interactive lecture sessions covering topics such as common tumour sites, communication skills and approach to the patient, techniques for FRCR style exams, radiotherapy planning and exam style questions.
- DAY 3 - this will be structured as a 'mock' FRCR Part 2 examination and will take the format of clinical examinations.
- The course will be dynamic and interactive, and we will ensure that all candidates receive individual feedback and support.

Our Faculty

- Dr Jane Brown MBBS, MRCP, FRCR (Oncology), PGCME

Dr Brown is a Consultant Clinical Oncologist specialising in breast and lung cancer. She obtained her MBBS in 1998 from St George's Hospital Medical School, University of London and completed general medical training in London and Southeast England in 2002 culminating in obtaining MRCP (London, UK). Following this she completed Clinical Oncology training in 2013 with training posts across London and Kent including The Royal Marsden Hospital and Guys & St Thomas'. She has obtained FRCR in Clinical Oncology from The Royal College of Radiologists, London. She has a real interest and passion for education and is actively involved in medical education and training. She has undertaken additional qualification in this field (Post graduate certification in Medical Education) and is both an Educational Supervisor for Oncology trainees and College Tutor. Since 2014 she had been a co-organiser of the annual Canterbury Part 2 FRCR Course and is also a lecturer and examiner in this setting.

- Dr Rema Jyothirmayi MBBS, MD, DNB, MRCP, FRCR (Oncology), MA

Dr Jyothirmayi is a Consultant Clinical Oncologist specialising in breast cancer and gynaecological cancer. She obtained her MBBS in 1990 from Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram, and trained in Oncology at the Regional Cancer Centre where she obtained her MD (Radiotherapy) and DNB. She underwent further training in Clinical Oncology at The Royal Marsden Hospital, London, and obtained the MRCP (UK) and FRCR in Clinical Oncology from the Royal College of Radiologists, London, in 1999. Dr Jyothirmayi also completed the MA (Education in Clinical Settings) with distinction in 2011. She is actively involved in the education and training of Post-graduate Oncology trainees in the UK and is Course Director for the MSc Oncology Course at the Institute of Cancer Research, London. She has been an examiner on the Canterbury Part 2 FRCR Course annually since 2001.

Our Faculty

- Dr Kannon Nathan MBBS, BSc, MRCP, FRCR (Oncology)

Dr Nathan is a Consultant Clinical Oncologist specialising in head & neck (including lymphoma), gynaecological, non-melanoma skin cancers, sarcoma and until recently neuro-oncology. He also has a wealth of experience in gynaecology brachytherapy and advanced radiotherapy techniques. He graduated from St Bartholomew's and The Royal London School of Medicine and Dentistry in 2000. He undertook his oncology training in the Pan-Thames clinical oncology programme, working at The Royal Marsden Hospital, Mount Vernon Cancer Centre, Guys & St Thomas', Maidstone Hospital, and the Kent & Canterbury Hospital. He has obtained FRCR in Clinical Oncology from The Royal College of Radiologists, London. He has over 18 years of oncology experience and has a passion for teaching. He has previously helped organise the FRCR examinations and is a clinical supervisor for oncology trainees as well as keenly involved in radiographer training and development. He is involved with national radiographer training courses (at The Kent Oncology Centre) and lectures in head & neck cancer on the MSc Oncology Course, University of London. He has been a co-organiser of the Canterbury Part 2 FRCR Course since 2012 and is a lecturer and examiner on this course.

- Dr Rakesh Raman MBBS, MD, MRCP, FRCR (Oncology)

Dr Raman is a Consultant Clinical Oncologist specialising in colorectal/anal and urological cancer. He obtained his MBBS from Madras Medical College, Chennai followed by training in Geriatric Medicine there. He obtained his MD in Geriatric Medicine in 1999. He underwent further training in Clinical Medicine in the UK and obtained MRCP (UK) in 2003. Dr Raman trained in oncology as part of The London Deanery rotation with training at Kent Oncology Centre, Guys & St Thomas' Hospital and at The Barts Cancer Centre (St Bartholomew's Hospital). He was appointed as a Consultant Clinical Oncologist in March 2011. He is actively involved in the teaching and clinical supervision of oncology trainees at Kent Oncology and is clinical trials lead for Oncology at East Kent University Hospitals. He is a co-organiser of the Canterbury Part 2 FRCR Course and is a lecturer and examiner on this course.
